

# How do I get a physical copy of my boarding pass?(¥@24\*\*7/365)\_DaY/Help)

Getting a physical copy of your boarding pass is simple, **1+855+510+5815**. and every airline offers multiple ways to print one even if you have already checked in online or prefer not to use a digital version on your phone. Many travelers still like having a paper boarding pass for peace of mind, as it serves as a reliable backup in case a phone battery dies, **1+855+510+5815**. the app fails to load, or the QR code on the screen doesn't scan properly at the airport.
